- Mennonite Church Canada calls for prayer for Ethiopia and Eritrea - Mennonite Church Canada has just under a dozen congregations across Canada with roots in Ethiopia and Eritrea. Meserete Kristos Church in Ethiopia is the largest Anabaptist community worldwide with whom we have an intentional, sister-church relationship.

Ethiopia is experiencing a threefold threat of pandemic, famine and war. Crops are devastated due to a locust infestation and Ethiopia is now in the midst of intense conflict, while in the grip of a global pandemic. Pray for peace and healing in Ethiopia. Pray especially for the children; 42% of the population is below the age of 15. Pray also for the congregations here in Canada in our nationwide community of faith who carry deep concern for Ethiopia and Eritrea and for loved ones.

Introduction to our Advent series

The Advent Season is typically associated with a season of joyful anticipation. As children we may remember the countdown beginning, perhaps with an Advent calendar with a chocolate for every day. Decorations and lights come out of the closets and a whole new repertoire of music finds its way into our ears in anticipation of a season of joyful festivities. We look forward to celebrating the birth of Jesus. While this year's pandemic restrictions may keep us all closer to our homes than we would like, preparations for Christmas are nonetheless appropriate. This year's Advent theme, "On the Road . . ." conveys not only a contemplative anticipation but it elicits a sense of movement. It then begs the question: What are we moving towards? Does the movement end at Christmas? The birth of Jesus, Emmanuel—God with us, opens for us a new era of God journeying with us and we journeying with God along the road of faith and faithfulness. In preparation for such a journey, we begin with opening ourselves in **readiness** to new understandings and a willingness to **repent** and leave behind attitudes and priorities that obstruct our movement. This opens us to visions of the possibility of **restoration** and justices in our world as we finally approach the manger with the full **revelation** of the child. Such revelation indeed calls for **rejoicing** on Christmas Day. How will this revelation guide our steps into a new year as we continue our journey on the road? In the midst of this year's pandemic, let's allow prayerful contemplation to prepare us for the revelation of God's love manifest in the child. And then, individually and as a congregation, let's consider how we can continue to make this love manifest in our world, guided on this road by the **radiance** of Epiphany and Emmanuel – God with us!
