From the Pastor:

This week the trial of George Floyd concluded with a guilty verdict. Many have proclaimed that Justice has been done. But this is not the case. After Derek Chauvin's guilty verdict was read, Keith Ellison, Minnesota attorney general, gave a press conference and had this to say.

"I want to thank the community for giving us that time, and allowing us to do that work," he says. "That long, hard, painstaking work has culminated today."

"I would not call today's verdict justice, however, because justice implies true restoration, but it is accountability – which is the first step towards justice."

"George Floyd mattered," he says. "He was loved by his family and his friends. His death shocked the conscience of our community, our country, the whole world," Ellison says. "But that isn't why he mattered. He mattered because he was a human being."

"This has to end, we need justice," Ellison says.

"This verdict reminds us that we must make enduring, systemic, societal change."

When the Bible speaks of Justice, it is the kind that Ellison so boldly states; "justice implies true restoration." While Chauvin has been held accountable for his actions, justice will only be served once systemic injustices have been changed and BIPOC no longer fear for their lives or the lives of their children. Thus we continue to pray as Jesus taught his disciples, "Thy Kingdom Come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven."

Easter Season Theme

During the Easter Season (Easter to Pentecost) the theme for AMC's worship is "Rooted in Christ...Reaching out in Love." This was also the theme for the 2021 Mennonite Church Manitoba (MCM) Gathering earlier this winter. As a congregation of congregations MC Manitoba has always been "Rooted in Christ." "For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ." (1 Corinthians 3:11) While MCM has always been "Reaching out in Love," the changing times call us to continually reevaluate the collective mission. This is where the ellipsis is important. The full theme is "Rooted in Christ – in order to envision where we might be – Reaching out in Love." The theme points to the future where new possibilities and emerging opportunities are present in the changing times. Many churches, including AMC's leadership have wondered about the future. While congregations have adapted to life during a pandemic as best they could, there is the lingering question what will life be like after the pandemic? It is acknowledged that a return to the way things were before the pandemic is no longer viable. The world has forever changed. Can the church adapt while remaining faithful to its call? "Rooted in Christ... Reaching out in Love," is a call to faithful wonder and trusting curiosity in the God of Love knowing that the Body of Christ will always find new ways of manifesting in the changing world. This is our call; this is our hope in this Easter Season.

As part of our Easter Season Theme links to videos that highlight the ministries of Mennonite Church Manitoba will be available on AMC's website. There will be a new one each week beside the link to the worship service. It is a wonderful encouragement to see how our community of congregations are engaged in a shared ministry.
