Leadership from the Evangelical Mennonite Church Vietnam joined the meetings (online) on Saturday evening. Participants shared stories of God's work in changing lives in Vietnam and in Canada.

The pipeline is being built through Wet'suwet'en territory despite the fact that all five Hereditary Chiefs have unanimously opposed its construction. Allegra Friesen Epp will be returning to Unist'ot'en from Sept. 16-Oct. 6, as part of her internship with MC Canada's Indigenous-Settler Relations Office and Christian Peacemaker Teams' Turtle Island Solidarity Network.

There are a number of people at AMC who have been participating in the "Be it Resolved Challenge." This learning activity took place over the summer months into September and continues into the 21-22 winter season. They read a new compilation of all the ways that Mennonites have sought to interact with our fellow treaty peoples of indigenous decent.

Part of the engagement is asking some difficult questions about how we participate in the ongoing process of our indigenous neighbours. Like...

- *As you've learned more about who we are as treaty inhabitants as Mennonites on this land, how does that affect / change how you think about where you live? How you live?*
- *What have you discovered about yourself in your learning? -*
- *What has surprised you?*
- *What are some ways that you are seeking truth in reconciliation?*
- *What are the barriers in your journey?*
- *What kinds of resources are you finding helpful? What are you reading to further educate yourself?*

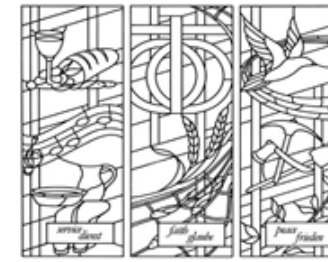

You might do so with a poem, an art piece, a short written reflection or sharing a story of relationship building. In this way we want to learn from each other and grow in our understanding. In the midst of our sharing, we are thankful for vulnerability, for truth seeking, and for trust.
