Greetings, friends!


Last weekend I was away at the Evolving Faith conference with a car full of some beloved MCM colleagues. We talked church, shared faith stories, ate together, and expressed both our laments and our dreams for the church. We took in many incredible speakers - from an Indigenous pastor & theologian to a Trans woman who lost her job as CEO of a Christian organization when she came out and now gives public speaking instruction for TED Talks. We took in fiery messages from a LatinX woman and a Black Baptist preacher. We listened to deeply personal stories of pain and heartache. We were schooled in theology and taken. To. Church.

I think I got saved multiple times. We sang, we made new ecumenical friends, and we participated in communion on Saturday night. Then the five of us went for supper and ended up at the same pizza joint as the moderator of the United Church of Canada and her colleagues - so we invited them to pull up chairs and we talked theology like old pals!

Sunday morning we got up early and attended a worship service across the street at the Presbyterian church in downtown Minneapolis, and when the woman beside me found out I was a Mennonite pastor from Manitoba she asked me if I knew Rick & Carol Sawatzky.

It was a lot packed into just a few days. I've been given much to think about, and I'm gonna want to rewatch and relisten to some of it! It was my first ever non Mennonite conference, and it was very different from the JJ Thiessen style event I know and love. But it was good for me to be there, to learn from other traditions, hear from different voices, and experience a totally different kind of faith gathering.

This week we pray for Pembina Mennonite Fellowship in Morden. Enliven and strengthen the congregation as they seek to be nurtured in faith and community, relying solely on lay leadership.
