From the Pastor - Greetings from a living snow globe!


The Formation Committee, along with Crystal Kehler (our outgoing church librarian – anyone interested?!), spent some time this week culling part of the library. If anyone wants to have a look, you're welcome to check out the table of discarded books in the library downstairs and see if anything interests you before we donate them. We were fairly ruthless.

I've done the church library purge thing before. And it's always interesting to see what was 'new and notable', or relevant to church goers in previous eras or generations. The story of God's people is an ever changing one, as we're learning in our worship series this fall. Over time, as society and the world evolve, as global issues and events arise and flux, the ways we view God and ourselves as related to God changes. The way we view others changes. And it seems to me that for as long as church libraries have existed, there has been an appetite for engaging our minds with these things. Hearing the stories of God's people.

I was surprised, for example, at how very many books there were on 'survival stories'. For example, child abduction was a whole theme, apparently, some decades ago. There were also a good stack of books that dealt with the topic of surviving/living with severe illness, disability, or children with disabilities. War time survival stories. Missionary tales of surviving cannibalistic tribal life in exotic lands and saving the souls of 'savages'. Not only has that language become inappropriate (we found a few books on 'Indians', too), but we consider that whole missional approach culturally insensitive today – at least in Mennonite Church Canada.

Over the past half century and beyond, there have been shifts away from stories of salvation and survival, to stories of (in)justice and restoration. They're all stories of struggle, in a way. The old stories and the recent ones. And this is our life and story, as Christians. It's an ever ongoing struggle – I believe a good one – in which we daily try to discern how our faithfulness to God is lived out in the world around us.

This week we pray for Nordheim Mennonite Church up north in Winnipegosis. [My grandma Hilda was born and raised in that community and church. I think I've been there for a wedding and a funeral.] We pray for Andrew Wiens, the minister of the congregation, and his family. We pray for the work of community engagement Andrew and Nordheim MC do together. May their lives be nourished and strengthened by Christ Jesus.
