- Pray for the church leaders at all levels of our conference.
- Pray for MCI.
- Let's pray for the Matheson Island community as they continue to work with other MCM congregations in mutually transformative partnerships. Pray for all in the community who are ill and fighting disease, and for the community to come together and have a renewed understanding of who God is in their midst.

Prayers for the World

- Palestine-Israel Network - Israel's massive military campaign in Gaza has brought untold destruction and suffering. At least three-quarters of the population of 2.3 million have been internally displaced, and more than 26,000 have been killed (two-thirds women and children). Let us hold in prayer those who are witnessing to God's peace through the four regional working groups of Mennonite Church Canada Palestine-Israel Network and the many local initiatives of Mennonite Action. On February 9, Mennonites will gather publicly in Ottawa and other centres around the country to sing hymns, pray, deliver petitions, and call on our political leaders to support a path forward based on justice, nonviolence, international law, and compassion.

Happy Anniversary, AMC!


